10 that correct?

11 A Correct, yes.

12 Q When you spoke to the officer was Mr.
13 Braunstein or Mr. Rotem with you when you spoke to the
14 officer?

15 A I don't recall.

16 Q I'm assuming someone was translating for
17 you; is that correct?

18 A Correct.

19 Q And who would that be?

20 A The second time Eli Polerak.

21 Q You said the second time? Was there a
22 first, Mr. Gorfinkel?

23 A I mentioned earlier during my testimony.

24 Q Do me a favor, Mr. Gorfinkel. I'm going
25 to ask a question and --

26 THE COURT: Put your hands down.

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2 Listen.

3 Q You said a second time. Was there a
4 first time that somebody translated for you before
5 that time in the hospital?

6 A No.

7 Q This is the first time somebody
8 translated for you; is that correct?

9 A Correct.

10 THE COURT: What is the name of the
11 person?

12 THE WITNESS: Eli Polerak.

13 THE COURT: How do you spell it?

14 THE INTERPRETER: E-l-i P-o-l-e-r-a-k.

15 Q Prior to go to the hospital did you speak
16 to Mr. Gur at all about what happened inside the room?

17 A No.

18 Q You didn't see him at all on your way to
19 the hospital prior to speaking to the police officer?

20 A Doesn't seem to me.

21 Q Was he at the hospital, Mr. Gur?

22 A Could be. Many lads arrived during the
23 night.

24 Q But do you have any recollection of
25 speaking to him at a hospital?

26 A I didn't say that.
